This is a course on Officer Survival where we identify and practice the skills you need to intervene or allow an intervention when you or another officer is about to do something that jeopardizes your career, your family or your freedom.

We know that action beats reaction. It is a basic tenet of all officer survival training.

Peer Intervention Training is about taking action to prevent a negative event so you don't have to react to that same event when it shows up on social media or the news. It's better for YOU, better for the department, and better for the community.

Ask yourself this, how much money would you save if you prevented just one (1) law suit per year?

Continue your training on August 15-17, in Oxford by attending the 29-hour program in Instructor Development and you will have a trainer in Peer Intervention for your entire department. This is the program adopted by the New Orleans Police Department (EPIC – Ethical Policing is Courageous©), and featured in the New York Times and the Police Executive Research Forum.

There will be a felonious line of duty death about every 135 hours in the United States and its territories.

There will be a reported officer suicide nearly every 60 hours. An officer will go to prison every 41 hours.

Average Sentence 34.6 months. **YOU can change those numbers.**
